LESSON

Read Scripture reference

King Herod was very anxious listening to these men. They spoke about ancient prophecies and a king whose kingdom was said to last forever. Herod thought maybe someone was coming to try to get rid of him and steal his own throne! If only he knew Jesus had come to be his king and Saviour too, he could have found joy with the wise men!

The wise men were looking for Jesus because they knew the ancient prophecies. They may even have known that Jesus would be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace!

Jesus is the everlasting king, but not just a king. The prophecy of Isaiah calls him the everlasting father. When we read through the gospels in the Bible its not hard to see why he's called a father. We see Him compassionately helping and healing, teaching His disciples like a father teaches His children. Telling stories just like your dad might. He encourages them when they need it, and lovingly and gently disciplines, showing the right way.

Jesus wants everyone to receive Him as their saviour. He wants to be our Father now and for eternity, when we will enjoy everlasting life with Him.

"And he will be called: Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." Isaiah 9:6b (NIV)




PARENT TIME:
